We meet as entire team each quarter and have an annual team trip away together.




The variety of projects meant I got to work with individual farmers and entities, network at discussion groups, but also step up and be involved in larger industry projects – that's pretty unique.

- A minimum of introductory level Te Reo Māori.
- Developing competency in core industry software and applications.
- Professional membership (NZIPIM) and associated events and learning opportunities.
- Increasing capacity in critical thinking and problem solving.
- Exposure to clients and workstreams both behind and beyond the farm gate.
